
What Is the CAGE Assessment For Alcohol Or Drug **Problem?**

The C.A.G.E. assessment is a preliminary tool used by clinicians in screening for alcohol or drug addiction. The evaluation is based on a simple questionnaire consisting of four questions. In fact, C.A.G.E. is an acronym that stands for the following subjects of the four questions that comprise the test that is used for the assessment:

- C Cutting down on alcohol use
- A Annoyance from criticism about alcohol use
- G Guilt feelings about alcohol use
- E Eye-opening by having a drink in the morning to overcome a hangover



How the CAGE Test is Used

The CAGE test for preliminary profiling is not designed for use to self-diagnose a drug or alcohol problem. Licensed clinicians use the test as a helpful screening tool. Only such a healthcare professional has the expertise to diagnose an <u>alcohol problem</u> that can be used to prescribe a treatment program.

The Four CAGE Test Questions

Below are the four universally used questions that make up the CAGE questionnaire. People respond "Yes" or "No."

The test can be modified for use in either drug or <u>alcohol use assessments</u>. For the alcohol questionnaire, the test administrator inserts the word "drinking," as we have done below for the purpose of our example. For the drug use questionnaire, the tester instead inserts the words "drug use."

CAGE Test:

- 1. Have you ever felt you should cut down on your drinking?
- 2. Have people annoyed you by criticizing your drinking?
- 3. Have you ever felt bad or guilty about your drinking?
- 4. Have you ever had a drink first thing in the morning to steady your nerves or get rid of a hangover (eye-opener)?

How is the CAGE Test Score Calculated?

For each "Yes" answer, 1 point is added to the total score, and for each "No" answer, 0 points are added. A total of 2 points or above for the total score is evaluated as significant and a possible indicator of an <u>alcohol problem</u>.

What Should I Do With My CAGE Test Results?

The CAGE test should not be considered a conclusive test for the diagnosis of an alcohol problem, and it is not meant for self-assessment. It is designed for use with other evaluative processes employed by treatment specialists.
